INTERCULTURAL LIVING | ECONOMIES OF CHANGE

The second International Summer School hosted by the Neighbourhood University (UdN) will explore innovative models for design process, urban development and community engagement. 25 young architects, urban planners, landscape architects and urban designers will live and work on the UdN site for two weeks, exploring issues of intercultural living and economies of change within the context of urban development.

In the urban neighbourhood of Wilhelmsburg in Hamburg, Germany, the UdN is a laboratory, a construction site, a stage, an interactive learning space and a common space. The UdN is a multiple, polyvalent learning device, and will become both site and object for the Summer School.

The Summer School students will set off into the neighbourhood, working with the local community to investigate economies of change and the production of space and knowledge within the context of urban development and intercultural living. This process of engagement with urban reality will extend the field of urban studies and will be significant to the outcome of the two weeks.
